Checo recommended that La CURE follow the following bills...

- HB 7 (Edmonston) Domestic abuse.
- HB 37 (McCormick) Weapons/handguns
- HB 51 (Goudeau) Vehicular homicide
- HB 102 (Muscarello) Justifiable homicide
- HB 106 (Green) Eliminating the death penalty
- HB 175 (Landry) Copayments from inmates receiving medical and dental care
- HB 298 (Jordan) Removes exception for punishments
- HB 365 (Seabaugh) Possession of a firearm by a felon
- HB 404 (Nelson) Parole eligibility for juvenile offenders
- HB 660 (Cormier) Requires District Attorneys to retire at age 70
- HB 728 (Duplessis) Medical parole
- HB 730 (Duplessis) Parole eligibility for certain persons
- SB 240 (Jackson) Termination of probation expungements for violent crimes
- SB 303 (Foil) Occupational licensing
